We aren't talking about all the laughter and excitement (that's encouraged!), but about the loud and distinctive "pop" made when a paddle hits a ball. USA Pickleball recently announced its Quiet Category initiative for pickleball products in an effort to reduce the sport's sound output during recreational play. The objective is simple, to reduce the sports sound output without negatively impacting performance. As good neighbors in our community, the PTPC encourages all of our members that are replacing equipment to consider new "quiet" products when making purchases.
